The novel is reminiscent of the love the characters find for a lone bookstore in *The Readers of Broken Wheel Recommend* by Katarina Bivald.

Sixty-year-old Sophie loves art—she grew up in Gulfport, once known to have the most art galleries in the state. Now, Sophie's forlorn at all the loss of art culture, much less under intense pressure to keep the last art gallery in town open. Her ace of up her sleeve? Her family has owned the art gallery's building for decades. Her challenge? Her husband's bet on the stock market didn't pan out, and he wants them to sell the building to a condo developer.

At first, Sophie is against her husband's plan—until she sees their bank account figures. Not only has her husband's bet not panned out—they are also almost broke. Even her business account has been drained. Her husband admits to being addicted to gambling on stocks. Sophie is angry: Now, she might really have to sell her building and close the last Gulfport art gallery. In the end, a cute stranger rallies the town to save the gallery, and the council passes a new promise to fund the reopening of art galleries to bring the town back to its arts roots. Sophie and her husband begin therapy to see if they may re-open their trust too—though the cute stranger remains in Sophie's mind.
